

Command & General Staff Type 3 Workshop

This workshop is intended for state, local, county, city and federal individuals who manage multi-jurisdictional and/or interagency response emergency incidents. The class will focus on leadership principles, organizational skills, incident management techniques, transitional operations and skills in creating highly productive teams. Participants will look at the complexity and diversity of managing Type 3 fire, and have the opportunity to present a transitional package. Class discussion will be closely tied to the book “Managing the Unexpected”, by Dr. Weick and Dr. Sutcliffe

PREWORK: Student should bring a binder with the following documents from their local jurisdiction:

- Annual operating plans
- Cost share agreements
- Mutual Aid Agreements
- Pre-attack plans
- Local and National Mobilization Plan (federal dispatch center)
- Agreements with local land owners and cooperators
- Fire Management Plans
- Red Book, Complexity Analysis
- Delegation of Authority (Example in Red Book)
- Maps of Local Jurisdiction and cooperators

. Students should also bring:

- Interagency Standards for Fire & Aviation
- Fireline Handbook
- Incident Response Pocket Guide (IRPG)
- Interagency Incident Business Management Handbook
- ICS Forms: 201-202-203-206
- Example of Incident Action Plans (1 fire and 1 all risk)
